No doubt, this paragraph from *A Lantern in Her Hand* was more poignant because Capt. & Bess Streeter Aldrich had recently built their dream home in Elmwood, where they had lived for the past 13 years. Their fifth home in Elmwood, "the Elms" was perfectly suited for a family of six. The beautiful 3,400 square foot prairie mansion home was built for \$7,000 in 1922; and yes, we are celebrating its 100th birthday this year!

As our community's latest centenarian, the Bess Streeter Aldrich House will be hosting three amazing exhibits, providing commemorative items for guests, and offering several special events. This newsletter will provide you more details about these activities, pique your curiosity, and hopefully build your desire to visit in 2022.

One of our most exciting developments is the creation of "Letters from the Elms," a 100-page booklet with copies of letters Mrs. Aldrich wrote during her years at the Elms. It includes letters to her readers, publishers, and friends, and a collection to friend Marie Clements. The booklet is available for sale or as a gift to foundation members who join at the Lantern level.



Yet, there is another reason to visit this summer. The Aldrich House was selected by the Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation as one of 28 historical sites across the state to participate in WanderNebraska, a new program designed for lovers of travel and history. Learning Center Update!



You may remember that the Aldrich Foundation Board joined with the local Legion Post to purchase this building located at 221 South 4th Street. The building has three offices and a large 40' x 40' room in the back that we intend to upgrade into a future museum and community learning center. We were successful in renting the offices and started fundraising efforts to pay for the building. Last fall, the Elmwood Cultural Arts and Learning Center board expand-

ed its mission by starting the Elmwood Community Foundation, an affiliated fund of Midland Community Foundation. Its intent is to help facilitate the transition of this building into the museum and assist other local nonprofit organizations and their missions. We received a generous \$10,000 donation from Keith Swarts and Jayme Nekuda and over \$12,000 in matching funds from other benefactors. Because the donations were made during a match period, Midland Community Foundation contributed another 17 percent. In the end, the fundraising efforts raised over \$31,000! Based on these results, the board approved the installation of a new HVAC system for the Learning Center this spring. You will be able to see proposed renovation plans and explore the building up close during our June 12 event from 12:30 to 1:30. Thank you for your support!

To generate a fictional short story that is written in the wholesome spirit displayed by Bess Streeter Aldrich in her works while incorporating a theme that focuses on Nebraska's family life, economy, history, cultural diversity, and/or geography (past, present, and/or future). Writers are encouraged to focus on historical and/or realistic topics remembering that Mrs. Aldrich had a passion for Nebraska, small-town dynamics, and family antics. No essays, please.
